Reclaimed VAT – The claim payment for 2016/17 was not received in time to be included with last year's Annual Return, and 2 years claims were received in accounting year 2017/18 instead of the usual 1 claim.

The County Council have reduced spending because of 'austerity cuts' meaning that the Parish Council has had to pay for things that have previously been paid for by the higher authorities. A TAP fund grant was received towards weed spraying of Giant Hogwart and other clearance projects during FY 2017/18.

The great majority of variance is because in 2016, a 'one off' donation of £30,000 was received from the developer of a local 'Solar Panel Farm' for the use of local organisations/groups. £24460 was distributed last year and a further £3400 distributed in FY ending March 2018.

The increase in the hire of Parish Hall was brought about simply because an invoice which would normally be received and paid February/March time was late and not received and paid until April. The invoices are for 6 months hire, therefore 2 invoices a year. This meant that in FY ending March 2017 only one payment for 6 months hire of hall was made and in FY ending March 2018, three payments were made.

Various P3 footpath maintenance projects were completed this year in addition to the normal routine maintenance works.

The County Council have reduced spending because of 'austerity cuts' meaning that the Parish Council has had to pay for things that have previously been paid for by the higher authorities. Drain and culvert clearing costs have been included under Highways maintenance for FY ending March 2018.

In the Budget for 2017/18, it was unanimously agreed to start giving an annual grant of £800 to West Down Village Green Field Association.

In 2016, A 'one off' donation of £30000 was received from the developer of a local 'Solar Panel Farm' for the use of local organisations/groups. £24460 was distributed last year and £3400 distributed in FY ending March 2018.
